### **Helping Every Child Learn**

The best way to inspire our students to learn is by inspiring our teachers, and providing opportunities for <u>them</u> to continue learning. On Monday, January 19<sup>th</sup>, the Clifton Cheder General Studies teachers, Early Childhood teachers, and assistants benefited from a professional development day.

Miriam Manela OT presented the second part of a workshop series she began for our staff last year. The teachers learned how students are "wired differently" and as such, have different ways of responding to challenges or frustration. They learned how to identify these varied types, as well as some practical classroom interventions to address each one, followed by an opportunity to practice these techniques. All the ideas presented involved creating a meaningful connection with the student and are based on individual variations in attachment style.

The General Studies Staff had an additional workshop run by our very own Montessori trained Rabbi Presberg. Rabbi Presberg demonstrated how to create an environment in the class where every student is an active participant and no student is able to


to ensure that these objectives are met. The specific tools that were shared hold every student accountable and is done in a gentle, respectful way.
